#### ABOUT CAMP KATER!

Camp Kateri is located just 30 minutes southeast of Gainesville, Florida. The 550-acre site is a beautiful setting for equestrian, aquatic, and adventure activities.

During their stay at Camp Kateri, girls live in cabins, platform tents, and treehouses. Each unit has flush toilets, running water, and electricity in the unit houses. Camp Kateri is owned and operated by Girl Scouts of Gateway Council. Inc.

Strict standards established by Girl Scouts of the USA and the American Camp Association guide camp administrators in safety, staffing, programming, and property management. Camp Kateri is committed to ensuring that participation is a diverse blend of campers and staff, including all races, religions, ethnic backgrounds, and physical abilities.

#### NON-GIRL SCOUTS WELCOME AT GIRL SCOUT CAMP!

For campers not registered as members of Girl Scouts of Gateway Council, there is an additional charge of **\$30 per session.** Parents give permission for their camper to be registered as a Girl Scout by signing the bottom of the camp registration form.



### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

The health and safety of your camper is our primary concern. All campers are required to have a completed health form (within 6 months) AND a health exam (within 24 months), including shot records, upon arrival at the camp session. Camp Kateri no longer holds records from previous summers, so all campers will need to bring all health information in 2012. Campers are screened at check-in to verify general good health (including head lice check) and proper health information (including medication). Camp reserves the right not to admit

### SPECIAL NEEDS CAMPERS

an ill person.

Every attempt is made to accommodate girls with special needs. Please contact the Camp Director at least two weeks prior to your session to discuss the specific needs of your camper and what reasonable accommodations we can make to assist in making your camper's experience a positive one.

### TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from camp is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. For sessions that include trips off-site, trained staff will transport campers in 15-passenger vans.

### FOOD SERVICE

All meals are prepared by a state-certified cook. Most meals are served family style in the dining hall. A snack is provided every day, and at least once a week girls will cook out in their unit. If your camper has special dietary needs or food allergies, please contact the Camp Director at least two weeks prior to your session to discuss reasonable accommodations.

### TRADING POST

Camp Kateri's Trading Post carries a variety of items for sale: stuffed animals, cups, and other novelty items, as well as stationery and stamps. Please do not include Trading Post money with camp registration fees. Cookie Dough may be used at the Trading Post.

### CAMP STAFF

- Camp staff completes: application, three references, interview, background check, and a drug test.
- Unit staff includes counselors 18 years of age and up, with at least one counselor 21 years of age. Junior counselors, ages 16 and 17, may also assist.
- The majority of our staff are college students or college graduates who have experience working with children.
- Camp staff attend a week-long training prior to camp. Staff are certified in First Aid and CPR, and are trained in child care and specific job responsibilities.
- Specialty staff are trained in their area of expertise.



### PROGRAM AIDE

July 22-27, 2012

### Entering 7th-8th grade

Become fully Program Aide (PA) trained during this week at camp! Learn leadership and event-planning skills while you work with younger Brownie and Junior Girl Scouts. You'll still have time for fun with your friends!

Pre-requisite: completion of the LIA award.

Cost: \$350

### **AQUATIC LEADER**

July 3-13 2012

### Entering 8th-10th grade

Do you love getting out on the lake? Jumpstart your Aquatic Leader experience as you spend two weeks learning about canoeing, kayaking, sailing, and archery! You'll also learn the basics of lifeguarding as you complete the American Red Cross GuardStart program. Head home on Friday, then use your new leadership skills to help out during your second week at camp. Campers will earn the basic Canoeing, Kayaking, Sailing, and Archery strips offered at Aquatics Weekends.

**Pre-requisite:** PA training. Campers must be able to pass a swim test: jump in feet-first and submerge head, swim 50 yards using any stroke that keeps head above water, and tread water for two minutes. Girls must be at least 11 years old to earn the GuardStart certification.

### CITI

July 3-27, 2012

### Entering 9th-12th grade

Learn the skills necessary to be a great camp counselor! Spend three weeks developing your leadership, communication, camping, and interpersonal skills while you prepare for an internship as a counselor. Visit a nearby ACA camp to learn more about the camping industry and learn from other programs. CITs arrive on Sundays and leave on Fridays.

Pre-requisite: Campers must submit an application prior to confirmation. Application available online. The Camp Director will contact applicants for an interview. Successful applicants will be notified of acceptance into the program beginning February 6, 2012.

### CIT II

### June 17-July 13, 2012

### Entering 11th-12th grade

Spend your first week reviewing all your camp and leadership skills, then put them to use in specialized areas for the next three weeks. Specialization areas include: counselor, equestrian, waterfront, craft, program, or administrative positions. CITs arrive on Sundays and leave on Fridays. CITIIs are eligible to apply for available camp staff positions for the remaining weeks of camp; however, acceptance is not guaranteed.

**Pre-requisite:** Completion of CIT I. Campers must submit an application prior to confirmation. The Camp Director will contact applicants for an interview. Successful applicants will be notified of acceptance into the program beginning February 6, 2012.

#### CAMP FEES

The base fee for resident camp is established on six days of overnight camping at Camp Kateri. The fee covers the cost of all food, regular program supplies, camp t-shirt, badges earned at camp, qualified staff, and housing. Extra charges cover special program costs. Cookie Dough earned from selling cookies can be applied towards the session fee. Non-Girl Scouts and Girl Scouts from another council pay an additional \$30 per session.

#### REGISTRATION

#### REGISTRATION BEGINS FEBRUARY 6, 2012

Registration begins on-line on February 6, 2012. A \$25 non-refundable deposit is required per session. All on-line registrations will receive an electronic confirmation packet. Paper registrations can choose an on-line or mailed confirmation packet. Confirmations will be sent within 2 weeks of receipt of the registration.

Confirmations sent by postal service will be addressed to the girl attending camp.

### PLEASE READ ALL PROCEDURES CAREFULLY BEFORE COMPLETING THE REGISTRATION FORM!

- 1. Register only one camper per registration form.
- 2. Please print or type the form neatly.
- 3. Please use black or blue ink only.
- Please check all dates, age requirements, fees, and pre-requisites carefully.
- Please list your session choices in the appropriate boxes. All
  registrations will be on first-come, first-served basis. You will
  increase your chances of attending camp by listing a 2nd choice.
  If your camper wants to attend more than one session during the
  summer, you will need to indicate two 1st and 2nd choice sessions.
- Enclose your deposit or full payment with the registration form.
   A \$25.00 deposit is required for each session. Resident Camp fees should be paid in full two weeks prior to the session. After this date, deposits and reserved spaces will be forfeited if full payment has not been received.

7. Cookie Dough may be used! You will need to get this from your Girl Scout Leader after the cookie sale program is over. Don't delay your registration; send it in to secure the session you want. After receiving your confirmation packet, you may use Cookie Dough to pay for your camp session. Cookie Dough is non-refundable.



### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

If you are a current member of Girl Scouts of Gateway Council and need financial assistance, please complete the financial assistance application and submit it with the camp registration form and \$25 deposit.

Applications for financial assistance must be submitted on paper. You may reserve your space by registering online, or by submitting the Financial Assistance Application with your paper Camp Registration.

All information submitted is kept confidential. Please submit both forms as soon as possible for greater chances of enrollment into the session of choice. You will be notified of the status of your financial assistance request within two weeks of the receipt of your registration.

Decisions for financial assistance are based on the amount of financial assistance money available, the ability of the applicant and members of the household to pay a portion of the costs, and the session for which the application is being made. Other considerations include participation in Girl Scout activities, including the product sale programs and services to the Girl Scout organization. Financial assistance is only available for one session per summer per girl.

### REFUND POLICY



If a refund is administered, it will not include the non-refundable \$25.00 deposit. Refunds for **Dad and Daughter** will not include a non-refundable \$10.00 deposit (per person). For campers not registered as members of Girl Scouts of Gateway Council, an additional \$15 is non-refundable.

The balance of the camp fees are refundable only under the following conditions:

- If the session is canceled by Girl Scouts of Gateway Council, Inc. or a camp session is full, a full refund will be issued.

**NOTE:** Refunds will not be made if the camper voluntarily withdraws or is removed from camp during the session for any reason. If a refund is administered it will not include the non-refundable \$25.00 deposit for the camp session.
